## **ACADEMIC INFORMATION**

### **Language of Instruction - Portuguese**

The language of instruction is Portuguese. While there is no specific proficiency test required for Portuguese, a basic knowledge of that language is recommended, which can be acquired through private courses or online platforms such as Duolingo, for example.

### **Language Requirements - English**

Students are required to provide a certificate demonstrating their English proficiency, with a minimum of B1 on the CEFRL scale. Alternatively, the sending institution can evaluate and confirm the student's language proficiency by completing a specific form provided by FEA-RP/USP.

For courses conducted in English, a B2 level or higher is recommended.

Students for whom English is their native language are exempt from providing proof of proficiency.

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION

#### **HEALTH INSURANCE**

Prior to arriving in Brazil, students are required to have health insurance coverage for the entire period of their studies.

## **CPF- Brazilian Individual Taxpayer Registry**

The CPF - Cadastro de Pessoas Físicas ("Individual Taxpayer Registration") is a document issued by the Federal Revenue Service of the Ministry of Finance, containing various information about taxpayers and their income. Its primary role is to uniquely identify individuals for tax purposes within the Federal Revenue Service. While the CPF is not mandatory, it is required in certain situations such as opening bank accounts, obtaining credit, renting accommodations (e.g., Airbnb), purchasing airline tickets, and more.

Foreigners can easily obtain a CPF registration through the Brazilian Embassy or Consulate when applying for a visa. This process is straightforward and efficient.

#### OR

In Brazil, students have the option to visit the Federal Revenue agency in person for this purpose. The issuance of the document involves a corresponding fee.

#### **CRNM (MANDATORY)**

Foreigners are given a minimum of 30 (thirty) days starting from their arrival in Brazil to complete their registration with the Federal Police in the city where they intend to reside. This is necessary to obtain the CRNM (Carteira de Registro Nacional Migratório - National Migration Registry Card), an essential identity document for foreigners in Brazil. This process is mandatory in accordance with Brazilian Migration Law. The International Office at FEA-RP will provide assistance to students throughout this procedure.

## Visa and Registration with the Federal Police

#### **Before traveling to Brazil:**

Exchange students are required to obtain a specific student visa, known as the **TEMPORARY VISA ITEM IV**, from the Brazilian Embassy or Consulate in their home country before entering Brazil.

Please note that a TOURIST VISA or WORK VISA **does not** grant students the authorization to register at USP or access university facilities. If you have any inquiries or uncertainties concerning the visa process, kindly reach out to us <u>BEFORE</u> your departure to Brazil.

Individuals from abroad who intend to study or engage in scientific research activities in Brazil are required to acquire a student or researcher visa from the Brazilian Embassy or Consulate in their home country. The necessary documents and procedures may differ based on individual circumstances. # Center for Physical Education and Sports Recreation

The Center for Physical Education and Sports Recreation (CEFER) is a versatile sports complex comprising a gymnasium, indoor and outdoor sports courts, a tennis court, a semi-Olympic swimming pool, an official athletics track featuring a synthetic surface, soccer fields (including an official one), an ecological hiking trail, and dedicated rooms for various physical activities like judo, weightlifting, gymnastics, and fitness.

CEFER provides both semester-long courses and a range of supervised sporting and recreational activities led by experienced sports professionals. These initiatives focus on promoting health and fostering interaction between the university and the local community.

To access and utilize CEFER's facilities, students are required to submit a Medical Certificate affirming their physical capability to engage in such activities. This certificate can either be obtained from their home country (in English) or be issued by a licensed Brazilian medical practitioner.

#### **Grading System**

#### Undergraduate

Grades may range from **0,0** to **10,0** and they can be rounded to the nearest tenth. The student whose final grade in each course is **5,0** or higher, and whose attendance is **70%** or higher, shall earn the applicable credits.

One class credit corresponds to **15** contact hours in a semester, and one work credit corresponds to **30** hours in a semester.

The transcript is complete and is showing any failures and/ or registration suspension.

1 USP credit is equal to 1,5 ECTS

#### **Grading System**

#### Graduate

The student achievement in each subject shall be expressed by one of the following concepts:

A: Excellent;

B: Good;

C: Satisfactory;

R: Fail (no credits earned);

T: Transferred.

The student whose final grade is A, B, or C, and whose attendance is 75% or higher, shall earn the applicable credits.

The completion of the necessary studies at Master's or Doctorate programs is expressed in units of credit. The credit unit corresponds to 15 hours of activities.

#### **Housing Program**

Administered by a student organization named "iTeam USP-RP," the Housing Program endeavors to assist incoming students in locating suitable accommodations in Ribeirão Preto. This initiative strives to provide support by facilitating the housing search process.

The costs of accommodations fluctuate based on the particular house or apartment that exchange students opt for. Typically, these lodgings are shared among both Brazilian and international students.

It's important to note that neither USP nor FEA-RP provide student housing on campus.

## **Buddy Program**

iTeam USP-RP additionally coordinates the Buddy Program, a well-structured initiative where FEA-RP students are carefully chosen to serve as mentors for international counterparts. These Buddies play a vital role in aiding new students upon their arrival in the city. They introduce them to the school environment, offering comprehensive assistance throughout their entire stay.

## **Books/Study material**

Most of the course materials are available for free at the University Central Library.

#### **Personal expenses**

We approximate the monthly expenses to be around BRL2,000.00 (equivalent to USD335.00), encompassing housing and meals.
