Programme Structure	<p>The Kedge Bachelor program is a 3-years Bachelor programme. Each academic year is divided into 2 semesters. See detailed calendar on page 2.</p> <p>Fall semester:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Orientation programme: September 04th, 2017 - Classes start: September 11th, 2017 - End of Final exams: December 16th, 2017 (re-sit exam session: From July 2nd to July 4th) <p>The Spring Semester:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Orientation programme: January 9th, 2018 - Classes start: January 15th, 2018 for Year 2 classes (January 22nd for Year 3 classes) - End of Final exams: April 27th, 2018 (May 18th for Year 3 classes) - Re-sit exams session between June 18 and June 29 																								
Course Offer and Registration	<p>Course offer: the list of courses offered in each semester can be found on page 2. All courses are taught in English. In addition to the KEDGE Bachelor courses, students may also be able to take courses from the IBBA programme, and mix courses from both programmes, according to the course levels.</p> <p>Course schedule: the information regarding the time (morning or afternoon) at which each class will be taught will be available later, on the online course selection application.</p> <p>Course syllabi: www.campusvirtuel.net > select the English flag at the top right hand corner > do not log in, instead click on: "Net Syllabus (Public Access)" to the left > Select the academic year and the semester; School: Marseille; Training: KEDGE BACHELOR Marseille; Level: KBM2</p> <p>French language courses are available at different levels during the Fall and the Spring semesters. A placement test is compulsory to register to this course. Instructions will be sent by email to the student throughout June/November.</p> <p>Course load: Each management course is worth 5 ECTS credits and represents 30 contact hours. At KEDGE BS, the usual workload for a full time student is 30 ECTS credits per semester (6 classes). However, as for exchange students, the home institution decides on the number of credits to be completed by its own students.</p> <p>Language of instruction: all of the courses are taught in English. Students will need to provide an English proficiency certificate equivalent to TOEFL IBT 79.</p> <p>Registration: students will receive an e-mail detailing the course registration process. The school reserves the right of admission in every case and of awarding available places according to compliance with requirements.</p>																								
Evaluation and transcripts	<p>Attendance in all courses in compulsory.</p> <p>Each course will be individually evaluated.
